Presenting problem:		

After examining the above animal patient and in accordance with The California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section 2038 Alternative Therapies; Chiropractic and Other forms of Musculoskeletal Manipulation defined as: The term musculoskeletal manipulation (MSM) is the system of application of mechanical forces applied manually through the hands or through any mechanical device to enhance physical performance, prevent, cure, or relieve impaired or altered function of related components of the musculoskeletal system of animals. MSM when performed upon animals constitutes the practice of veterinary medicine.

MSM may only be performed by the following persons:

(1) A Veterinarian Who:

a. Has examined the animal patient and has sufficient knowledge to make a diagnosis
of the medical
condition of the animal, has assumed responsibility for making clinical judgments
regarding the health of the animal and the need for medical treatment
b. Has determined that MSM will not be harmful to the animal patient, discussed with the
owner of the

animal or the owner's authorized representative a course of treatment, and is readily

available or has made arrangements for follow-up evaluation in the event of adverse reactions or failure of the treatment regimen.

c. The veterinarian shall obtain as part of the patient's permanent record, a signed acknowledgment from the owner of the patient or his or her authorized representative that MSM is considered to be an alternative (nonstandard) veterinary therapy.

(2) A California licensed doctor of chiropractic ("chiropractor") working under the direct supervision of a veterinarian. A chiropractor shall be deemed to be working under the direct supervision of a veterinarian where the following protocol has been Followed:

a. The supervising veterinarian shall comply with the provisions of subsection 1 prior to authorizing a chiropractor to complete an initial examination of and/or perform treatment upon an animal patient.

b. After the chiropractor has completed an initial examination of and/or treatment upon the animal patient, the chiropractor shall consult with the supervising veterinarian to confirm that MSM care is appropriate, and to coordinate complementary treatment, to assure proper patient care.

c. At the time a chiropractor is performing MSM on an animal patient in an animal hospital setting, the supervising veterinarian shall be on the premises. At the time a chiropractor is performing MSM on an animal patient in a range setting, the supervising veterinarian shall be in the general vicinity of the treatment area.

d. The supervising veterinarian shall be responsible to ensure that accurate and complete records of MSM treatments are maintained in the patient's veterinary medical record.

I refer this patient to (the	I refer this patient to	(the
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Doctor of Chiropractic) for concurrent and follow up chiropractic care, with the understanding that the chiropractor will in no way do anything that is construed as the practice of veterinary medicine, will refrain from doing anything deleterious to this animal patient, will notify me immediately if there is any indication of negative reactions or if they observe anything which would be considered by any normal person to be unusual or that might lead to further problems with the animal's health. Failure to abide by this referral agreement will result in termination of this referral and absolve the referring veterinarian from any liability associated with the actions of the chiropractor. The chiropractor also agrees to make regular progress reports to the referring veterinarian to become part of the patient's permanent record.
